1. Expansive Vista in Frigiliana

"One of the most beautiful villages in Andalusia, Frigiliana cannot be skipped. Stroll the cobblestone streets and journey up to castle ruins that remain at the top of the village. 2. The Historic Alhambra & Generalife of Granada

3. The Dramatic Canyons below the King's Little Pathway of El Chorro
